California STEM Learning Network (CSLNet)

Central Coast STEM Education Collaborative (CCSTEM) operations are challenging enough just for our own geographical area from San Miguel to Carpinteria, representing 100,000 K-12 public school students. Doing everything ourselves would be an overwhelmingly monumental effort if it were not for the vital support and guidance from an extremely important partner who is watching out for STEM education for all California public school students.

CCTEM is one of eight <u>California STEM Learning Network</u> regional alliances. We are part of a network of other similar STEM regional education organizations that are attempting to do the same thing we are -- improving STEM education for school students. The other California alliances are Sacramento, East Bay, Silicon Valley, Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Orange County and San Diego. Other regional areas may soon join this network.

CCSTEM representatives attend periodic meetings and conferences with representatives from the other regional alliances to compare notes, learn new approaches and share resources. This collaborative effort is a very powerful part of an effort to pull all California public school districts together in bolstering STEM education.

We are extremely pleased and proud to be a member of CSLNet.

I have been involved in past Balloon Fest events and can attest to the outstanding science and engineering experience for students and educators and the extremely rewarding experience for adult volunteers.
