Back By Popular Demand: Molecular Gastronomy, or... The Science of Playing with Food

San Luis Obispo, CA – (immediate release) The Central Coast STEM Collaborative (CCSTEM), presents the fourth installment of the educational lecture series "Science After Dark" at 6:30pm, December 9, 2015, at Steynberg Gallery in San Luis Obispo. Dr. Nanine Van Draanen, assisted by Cal Poly students and staff, will demonstrate one of the latest food crazes, "molecular gastronomy," a term coined in 1992 by late Oxford physicist Nicholas Kurti and the French INRA chemist Hervé This. Molecular gastronomy is a subdiscipline of food science that seeks to investigate, explain and make practical use of the physical and chemical transformations of ingredients that occur while cooking, as well as the social, artistic and technical components of culinary and gastronomic phenomena in general. Attendees of all ages will enjoy taste-testing the concoctions.

Dr. Van Draanen is Interim Associate Dean, <u>College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences</u>, at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. Her research interests include synthetic, organic and medicinal chemistry; pedagogical methods in organic chemistry; preparation of allicin analogues and their roles in blood pressure regulation and migraine; and lipophilic acetates as transdermal cyclooxygenase inhibitors as anti-inflammatory agents for burn treatment. Dr. Van Draanen is a 1985 Cal Poly alumna and returned to Cal Poly in 1996, after serving several years as a scientist for Burroughs Wellcome Co. and Glaxo Wellcome Inc., where she earned a 1994 Excellence Award and a 1990 Special Performance Award. She has published several papers in peer-reviewed journals, holds one patent and has submitted four patent applications. She earned a doctorate from UC Berkeley in 1992.
